

Generator Guidelines

The Architectural Review Committee will follow these guidelines when evaluating a request from a unit owner for installing a permanent generator.

Installation Guidelines as follows:

- 1. The generator should be placed no more than 10 feet from the electric panel and no more than 18" from the home's foundation wall.
- 2. The Generator must be placed in an existing mulch bed or one created for that purpose.
- 3. Homeowner is responsible for removing/adding existing plants and adjusting the irrigation as necessary, as well as the cost of installing the mulch bed and any irrigation repairs.
- 4. Generator is to be powered by Natural Gas. Temporary generators powered by gasoline or diesel are not permitted due to carbon monoxide emissions.
- 5. The generator will be white, silver, gray or earth tone in color and be screened as best as possible from view.
- 6. All necessary permits and inspections by the City of Goodlettsville are to be obtained and copies submitted upon request to the HOA Board of Directors.
- 7. Generator installation to be done by a licensed and insured contractor.
- 8. Any damage to Vineyard Private Elements and/or Common Elements will be the homeowner's responsibility to repair.
- 9. Under no circumstances shall a unit owner install a generator without completing and submitting an AIA form and getting written approval from the HOA Board of Directors.
- 10. All future maintenance to the generator will be the responsibility of the current unit owner as well as future owners of the unit.
- 11. The decibel level of the generator may not exceed 70 db's at 20 feet.
